




From Safari.....

This weekend, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), marks the beginning of the National Eucharistic Revival.


Scandal, division, disease, doubt is ever present in our world. The Church has withstood each of these throughout our very human history. But today we confront all of them, all at once. Our response in this moment is pivotal. In the midst of these roaring waves, Jesus is present, reminding us that he is more powerful than the storm. He desires to heal, renew, and unify the Church and the world. How will he do it? By uniting us once again around the source and summit of our faith—the Holy Eucharist. The National Eucharistic Revival is the joyful, expectant, grassroots response of the entire Catholic Church in the U.S. to this divine invitation.

The revival is a three-year initiative of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. During the first year, efforts are focused on the diocesan level — this may include diocesan-wide events (See the bulletin for Diocesan events this Sunday and Monday), acts of service, days of prayer and healing, study groups, pilgrimages and outreach to those who are under-served. All of these activities will culminate with a Diocesan Eucharistic Congress in 2023 right here in our diocese. Today, (Sunday) there will be a Eucharistic procession following the Sunday morning Masses at Sacred Heart and St. Stephen.

In the second year, Area Catholic Communities will take the spotlight. ACCs and parishes will be encouraged to have days of prayer, study, devotion, outreach and their own ACC eucharistic congresses. At the diocesan congress, people will be given the tools to host these events and welcome people in their areas to attend, reaching out beyond parish walls and into the community.

At the end of the second year, the first National Eucharistic Congress in the United States in almost 50 years will happen in July 2024. Organizers envision 100,000 Catholics will join together in Indianapolis for this pilgrimage. Give prayerful consideration to being a delegate to the Congress.

This Sunday we are invited to reflect upon the mystery of the great meal which Jesus has given us. Every time we gather for mass, we enter into this one time sacrifice of Jesus' selfless love and are given the command to follow his lead each and every day of our lives. In the sharing of the bread and the wine, we recall the sacrifice that Jesus made to set us free from sin and death. No longer do we need to offer sacrificial offerings of bulls, sheep, or pigeons for forgiveness of sins and unity with God.



(Ministry & Life Perspectives Continued)

In the gospel the disciples, could be charged, with what some say is “stingy thinking”. The disciples looking at the 5,000 plus crowd, the remote location, and having only 5 loaves of bread and two fish, see the task of feeding the crowd to be impossible. They rely on their own abilities and fail to see what God can do. The gospel story reveals that God can take our gifts and multiply them for the benefit of many.

We also pray for and congratulate all our fathers. Fathers are called constantly to sacrifice themselves for the good of their children---attending activities, tending to injuries, sharing an ice cream cone, sitting and sharing tears of hurt or joy. Through countless sacrifices fathers teach their children and others, how to love unselfishly and thus make them better images of Christ. Thank you, Fathers, for being Eucharist to us!

Finally, on a personal note.... Thank you for the cards, well wishes, and gifts in honor of my 40 years of ordination to the priesthood. The years have gone quickly. I am moved by your kindness and generosity. Thank you for your inspirational acts of faith and love. I am truly blessed.

LIVING A LIFE OF DISCIPLESHIP



PRAYER is one of the 4 pillars of a lifestyle of Stewardship

Amazing! 68 kids, 13 catechists and all is quiet to hear the gong signaling the start of prayer before Faith Formation begins in Annunciation Hall. All are squashed into the hallway between classrooms to hear Sundays Gospel, "Can a blind person lead a blind person?" It is read by one of the 68. Two girls, close friends, are asked to act out the Gospel by walking around cones positioned on the floor. First one and then both are blinded. The girls share how it feels to rely on each other. Next it is time for prayer. Five years ago prayer was done separately, teachers with teachers and classmates in classrooms. Together prayer is spontaneous and free flowing from the heart, a spiritual moment. This happens every Wednesday. The 68 and the 13 call out names, express fears, and ask for help in suffering. They face a whiteboard where individuals have listed the names of those needing their prayers. This time is a favorite time. For the past five years it has been like this, praying together, not separately in classrooms. It is a healing moment. Faith, hope and charity in action through united prayer.


Monumental VBS Volunteers Needed



FINANCIAL UPDATE

One last look at our financial picture as we prepare to finish out the fiscal year on June 30th. Our regular adult giving is at \$856,631 against a budget of \$825,000. As the Finance Council budgeted for the unknown return to "normal" of 2021-2022, they were conservative in their numbers. The generous people of Sacred Heart have met and exceeded that number and we are so very grateful. For 2022-2023, we have budgeted \$875,000 for regular giving, and we must still consider the needs of the deficit budget...to meet that, our regular giving should be at \$906,500. This is a shortfall of \$49,869 (smaller than it was in April). While we end the fiscal year above budget, we enter our leanest time of the year. Summer finds people away at the lake or on vacation. Online giving is a great way to continue to support Sacred Heart when you aren't able to join us for Mass. If you would like to start or increase your online giving, for withdrawals directly from your checking or savings account, call the office. Online giving can also be set up and adjusted online through Vanco. Click on Online Giving from our homepage. Any questions, just call the office.

As we enter August, we will mail out a more complete look at the fiscal year.

We are nearing an agreement on our roof replacement and other necessary repairs from last August's storm damage. As many of you know, the volume of work in our area is high and we are committed to repairs within our insurance coverage so there is no added cost to the parish.




