From Safari.....

Echoing across the country this weekend, these lyrics from America, "My country, 'tis of thee, Sweet land of liberty, Of thee I sing; Land where my fathers died, Land

of the pilgrims' pride, From ev'ry mountainside Let freedom ring! "

In addition to song, parades, picnics, and fireworks will mark the days as we celebrate the freedoms we enjoy. According to one source nearly 700,000 men and women have died in battle protecting our freedoms. For their sacrifices we give thanks.

What is freedom? That question comes to mind as I am taking in the beauty of creation, as I bike or trek through the forest. The question surfaces as I am spending some time with family or a friend. Rest and recreation are important in our lives. But is there more to freedom?

Freedom is foremost a gift from God, won for us by Christ's passion and death; it is an absolute, the first necessity if we are to turn our lives over to God. Freedom, as St. John Paul II once noted "consists not in doing what we like, but in having the right to do what we ought." In other words the real value of freedom depends on what we do with it.

Freedom is rooted in the belief that we are all one. When we really believe and understand that, then we can follow the gospel without any reservation. Reluctance "the flesh" is that part that wants to take care of myself in my own way, instead of letting go and letting God take care of me through my response to whatever he calls me to do. The flesh is often the way in which the world thinks and leads to such behaviors as; impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, or addictions. Acceptance "the Spirit" is willing to make the sacrifices necessary for the benefit of the other. The Spirit is the way that God thinks and acts. When we surrender to the movement of the Spirit in our lives, others see in us: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness.

As we go about the Fourth of July week, let us remember: Christ frees us for something more than selfishness. Christ frees us and empowers us to love, to serve one another.




