

God made us to be in relationship with Him. He loves each of us individually. Through sin, our relationship with God was broken. He gave us Jesus to restore our relationship. Being a disciple of Jesus, we are given the model to obtain eternal life in Heaven. Christmas isn't about the material gifts we receive, it's about the love that God, Our Father, gave us by giving us His Son, Jesus — the best gift we could ever receive.

ST. STEPHEN

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin. Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death. Even in his final moments, St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow. ©LPi





NEW MASS TIME COMING TO SFX

St. Francis Xavier will be changing its Saturday evening Mass time from 5pm to 4pm, effective Saturday, January 14, 2023. This change comes after consulting with the OiC Planning Council and considering several factors. One consideration was being able to offer an additional Mass time, rather than the current schedule where both Sacred Heart and St. Francis Xavier offer Mass at 5pm. Another consideration was being able to offer an earlier Mass time on Saturday evening for those who do not like to drive in the dark during the winter. A third consideration was our presiders and retired priests. We currently benefit from a number of retired priests, but we may not always have this luxury. A change to 4pm at St. Francis Xavier would allow for a better break before a presider would need to go to St. Stephen for 7pm Mass should we need to cover the Saturday schedule with only 2 priests. Please watch for details regarding a revised schedule for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Thank you for your understanding.


