Ministry & Life Perspectives



The Jubilee Year of Hope is an inspired opportunity to respond to the turmoil so common today with the virtue we each received in our Baptism: hope, along with faith and charity.

Hope is God's gift of strength to us, the assurance that despite all the obstacles that emerge in the course of life and history, God's love will sustain us. Like Mary's experiences recounted in the mysteries of the Rosary, we will triumph through our sorrows and live with the unshakable promise of glory and perfect peace with all the saints.

Among the many initiatives to witness to being Pilgrims of Hope, I read the story of an international group of young people who are making a voyage of over a year around the Mediterranean Sea to build peace. The trip is sponsored by the Archdiocese of Marseille in France.

Pope Leo boarded the three-masted *Bel Espoir* (Beautiful Hope) while it was docked in Ostia, not far from Rome. Ostia is the site where St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine, died with her own beautiful hope of eternal life, as recorded in Augustine's Confessions.

The young people introduced themselves to Pope Leo and explained where they came from: Italy, France, Bosnia, Croatia, Spain, Palestine, Libya; in all, 14 countries around the Mediterranean were represented on board.

The Pope thanked them for letting him be part of the long journey of their pilgrimage. He said: "[your] dialogue means being able to learn to talk to one another, to sit down, to learn, to listen, to express your own ideas and your own values, as well as to have respect for one another so that other people will feel that they are truly being listened to.

"How wonderful an experience it is to get to know people, as you travel literally around the Mediterranean being from different countries and cultures, and speaking different languages ... we need to learn to live in peace. Be promoters of peace in a world that more and more tends towards violence, hatred, separation, distance and polarization."

And words spoken to the youth can also guide us:

"But I always remember a line from Saint Augustine – here we are in Ostia – who said: 'If you want to change the world and make the world a better place, you have to begin by changing yourself.' I hope and pray that for each one of you, that was a lesson that you have also learned during this time. How do I become a better person? How

do I become a promoter of peace? How do I become someone who lives as being really committed to promoting justice, fraternity, understanding, and respect for one another? And to say, I do that because of my faith in God and because of the Gospels. I believe Jesus Christ taught that very clearly, and he saved us all through his own suffering on the cross. He invites us to imitate his life and to serve one another. With that additional thought, I think we can indeed change the world. Thank you."

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Related to the Pope's comments, all are invited to [A Conversation About Hope](#) as part of our Jubilee Year observance on Saturday, November 1 at 3:00 p.m. at Sacred Heart's Parish Hall. Kathy Janku, Fr. William Orbih, and Daniella Zsupan-Jerome will share perspectives from their varied lives and vocations. The time will include Q and A and small group discussion, and conclude with the 5:00 p.m. Mass, which will be the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (or All Souls), reminding us of our ultimate hope, to share life with God forever.

Congratulations to our Confirmation candidates from Annunciation and Sacred Heart! Bishop Neary will be at Sacred Heart next Sunday afternoon, November 2, to bestow this sacrament of the indwelling Holy Spirit. Pray for these young disciples as they welcome the Spirit as Counselor and Guide.

Relics at Sacred Heart We will again have relics of St. John Bosco, St. Ignatius Loyola, and many others displayed for veneration during the month of November at Sacred Heart. These are first-class relics (a part of the physical body of a saint, approved by the Vatican as authentic). There are also two other classes of relics: second-class relics are items owned or used by the saint, and third-class relics are objects that have been touched to a first-class relic. The veneration of relics is grounded in Catholic faith that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit. When venerating a relic, you can spend a few moments in quiet prayer and devotion. You can also touch the relic and ask for intercession of the saints for any intentions you might have. We give thanks to God for the saint's holy lives and pray for the grace to imitate them!

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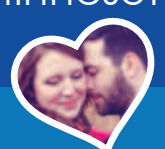
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
