From Safari.....

Some random thoughts.

Sartell Sally (rabbit), in the early morning hours of February 2nd, was eating from the tray set out for the squirrels. Unlike her fellow prognosticator Punxsutawney Phil, who

saw his shadow, Sartell Sally did not see her shadow. Spring is just around the corner.

Lent which is springtime begins on February 22nd. Lent gives us an opportunity to look beyond ourselves as we enter into the ancient practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Through these ancient practices may we discover our giftedness, take time to listen to God speak in our hearts, to be more attentive to the wonders around us, and praise God with all our being. Pope Leo the Great (5th century) taught this truth: Lent is a wonderful opportunity to live more fully and joyfully the life we are supposed to be living all year long.

In these days leading up to Lent, give thought to how you will observe Lent this year. What actions/practices will bring you to new life? You will be receiving in the mail a One In Christ ACC letter laying out some possible directions for your Lenten journey and the times of our various Masses and services — Sacrament of Reconciliation, Way of Cross, Holy Week Schedule.

Tuesday is an important day for our Diocese as Fr. Patrick Neary will be ordained as the 10th Bishop of St. Cloud. Let us hold him in our prayers and may our minds and hearts be open to his guidance. Unfortunately seating is limited at St. Mary's Cathedral, however you can participate in the ordination via livestream on the Diocese of Saint Cloud's YouTube channel.

Through the gospel this week, Jesus offers a different kind of perfection, one marked by patience and humility and openness to others even when we are challenged or criticized. A true disciple is always a work in progress, a sinner in need of forgiveness, a seeker who does not have all the answers, only better questions. They live by mercy, moved to serve others in simple anonymous ways, not driven by the high-octane ego that constantly needs to be recognized and revered by others.

Valentine's life was rooted in the gospel values of patience, humility, and tending to the needs of others. He is remembered for his love and outreach to the poor. It is unfortunate that St. Valentine's Day is known for romantic cards and gifts and not his life. Perhaps this week's Random Acts of Kindness week, which encourages everyone to reach out in unexpected ways to show kindness, can bring us closer to the faith Valentine lived out in his life. Let me suggest not only random acts but deliberately planned acts of kindness as an expression of God's love.

REVISED FORMULA FOR ABSOLUTION

For over 20 years now, the Church has been gradually revising vernacular language translations of liturgical texts to reflect more accurately the Latin originals, as required by the 2001 Vatican document *Liturgiam Authenticam*. The most visible product of this process was of course the Roman Missal which began to be used in Advent, 2011. The Order of Celebrating Matrimony, the Order of Christian Marriage, the Order of Confirmation, the Order of Baptism of Children, and a few other lesser-used texts have been completed. The most recent update is in the Order of Penance.

The changes here are minor, providing more options for readings and other texts for Penance services, various forms of an act of contrition, and updated Scriptural translations. But the change most will notice is in the formula of absolution prayed by the confessor, and the changes here are minimal. The formula will now read:

> God, the Father of mercies, through the Death and Resurrection of his Son, has reconciled the world to himself and poured out the Holy Spirit (previously: sent the Holy Spirit among us) for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church, may God grant (previously: give) you pardon and peace. And I absolve you from your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, + and of the Holy Spirit.

This new formula may be used beginning with Ash Wednesday this year, and becomes mandatory on the Second Sunday of Easter, or Divine Mercy Sunday (April 16). Rest assured that if the confessor happens to use the older formula – after having prayed it thousands of times over the years! – this does not in any way affect the validity of the sacrament. The core essential sacramental words - "I absolve you from your sins" – do not change.

Again, the changes are minor but more closely align with the Latin originals and parallel usages in the liturgy that speak of the lavish "outpouring" of the Spirit and God "granting" grace, underscoring the freely bestowed mercy of God.

STEWARDSHIP AND EVANGELIZATION

LIVING A LIFE OF DISCIPLESHIP

Today's readings challenge us to reflect on the true state of our hearts as it relates to stewardship. Do we think of stewardship as something we take care of once a year, simply a matter of ticking off boxes on a commitment card — or do we choose to embrace it as a spirituality and way of life that allows us to grow in conformity to Christ every day?

CHRIS

Our first reading, from the book of Sirach, teaches that our good God has given us freedom to make this choice — "Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him."

The concept of stewardship helps us to live out the fundamental choice to put God first. Stewardship is not meant to be a mere external exercise that we participate in on an occasional basis. It is meant to be embraced as a way of life a life that involves a continuous conversion of heart.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, Jesus illustrates the difference between an external observance of the law and a true conversion of heart, saying, "You have heard that it was said... you shall not kill... But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment." Our Lord is asking us not only for exterior acts, but for a true change of heart. In stewardship terms, that means seeing everything as a gift from Him, to be used for His glory and the good of others.

In the week ahead, let us examine the state of our hearts to ask ourselves if we have chosen to allow stewardship to become a way of life for us. Only then we will experience its true depth and heart-changing possibilities. The choice is ours.


