MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



From Safari.....

My seminary classmates and I spent a semester of study in Israel. Our home base was in Ein Karem, a suburb of Jerusalem. It was an incredible time. During our four months in Israel, we spent a week around the Sea of Galilee,

checking out Mount Tabor and the Jordan River, and a week in Sinai desert, climbing to the top of Mount Sinai and floating and camping out by the Dead Sea.

The Jordan River flows into two seas in Israel. One is fresh and full of life. It is surrounded by trees and small villages. People fish in it, boat in it, swim in it and it provides life and livelihood for many. It is the Sea of Galilee, around which Jesus spent so much of his ministry. The other sea is much larger. But there are few villages built around it. No one can drink from it or fish in it. Its water is stagnant and briny. It is the Dead Sea, the lowest geographical point on the earth.

How can they be so different: The Sea of Galilee has a river on both sides. It is fed by one and feeds the other. For every drop of water that comes in, one goes out – so the water is always fresh. The Dead Sea simply collects all the water that flows into it. No river flows out the other side. The water is still, salty and stale. Nothing can live in it.

The Sea of Galilee and the Dead Sea also describe different kinds of people. Like the Dead Sea, there are some who simply take, it is all about them. Very seldom are they reaching out to someone else. Some have a happiness that comes from the things of this world and they tend to use people. Look at how great I am. Others, due to misfortune, constantly grumble at how unfair life is. They wallow in their misery and zap the life of those who come in contact with them.

Others are like the Sea of Galilee, they are filled with life. They constantly strive to reach out to those around them. Even when faced with hardship they tend to be joy filled. Their joy comes not from the things of this world but their relationship with God.

To both types of people the love of God flows in. The latter realize that inner and outer peace and joy, come in sharing the love we receive. Someone once defined love, "Life has taught us that love doesn't mean gazing into each other's eyes, but instead it means we look outward together." Looking outward together is surely, what Jesus asks us to do. He urges us to look tenderly on our wounded world and do whatever lies in our power to make it a happier and more peaceable place. He once asked us to see him in anyone who hungers or thirsts, is sick or in any kind of prison. And in those moments when we find it difficult to see Christ in another, when we utter the heresy that here is someone who does not deserve to be loved. In those moments, that person needs to see Christ in us.

Lord help us to let your love move in and through us.

May your week be sprinkled with signs of God's goodness. Fr. Ron

MN BISHOPS-ERA LEGISLATION

From the Minnesota Bishops: Legislative Update on the Proposed Minnesota "Equal Rights Act" and on Assisted Suicide

It is clear that on the topic of human rights, freedom, and dignity, it is today especially easy to be misunderstood.

The Minnesota State Constitution has contained protection for unjust discrimination against any person related to their sexuality since 1993, along with limited exemptions for religious convictions. The Minnesota Supreme Court has repeatedly interpreted the state Constitution to uphold both protections against discrimination and sincere religious convictions. This tested balancing of interests in the Minnesota Human Rights Act ensures that the law is treated as a shield against unjust discrimination rather than a sword against those who hold faith-based views about human sexuality.

Ironically, the proposed Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) for the Minnesota Constitution would diminish hard-earned rights and protections for both women and men, and could eliminate conscience rights and religious liberty of all Minnesotans. It would also guarantee a right to abortion in our State Constitution.

The Minnesota bishops are urging Catholics to contact your State Representative by email, phone call, or video to oppose the proposed language of the "ERA" – not to discriminate against anyone, but to ensure that religious liberty and equal protection under the law for all persons will be preserved, not diminished.

You can learn more and speak up for human rights and religious liberty by going to MNCatholic.org and clicking on the Issues tab, and then going to the "Action Center" or go to <u>www.mncatholic.org/action 21473</u>.

You can also go to the Conference site to urge your legislators to oppose legalizing the medicalization of suicide in the "End of Life Options Act" and other matters connected with the common good for all ages.

Every human person possesses an infinite dianity. clear: inalienably grounded in his or her very being, which prevails in and beyond every circumstance, state, or situation the person may ever encounter. This principle, which is fully recognizable even by reason alone, underlies the primacy of the human person and the protection of human rights. In the light of Revelation, the Church resolutely reiterates and con firms the ontological dignity of the human person, created in the image and likeness of God and redeemed in Jesus Christ. From this truth, the Church draws the reasons for her commitment to the weak and those less endowed with power, always insisting on "the primacy of the human person and the defense of his or her dignity beyond every circumstance."

CEMETERIES-MEMORIAL DAY

<u>Memorial Day Flower / Decoration Rules for Assumption,</u> <u>Calvary, and Sacred Heart Cemeteries</u>

Memorial Day will be observed on Monday, May 27, 2024. With gratitude and respect for those who have served in our nation's military to preserve peace and freedom, Memorial Day is a time to honor our deceased veterans.

One common and beautiful way to do so is with flowers on the burial places of those we remember. Cemeteries are glad to accommodate this act of remembrance and hope. To assure good order for all, cemeteries have rules for what is permitted and appropriate. Below you will find the rules for the three diocesan cemeteries of Assumption and Calvary in St. Cloud and Sacred Heart in Sauk Rapids. (For other cemeteries, whether parish-based or civil, please contact the management of each cemetery through the parish or the county where it is located.)

Memorial Day Rules:

Vases can be turned over for use on the Saturday before Memorial Day (that is, on May 25).

Additional flowers may be placed on graves two days prior to Memorial Day (on Saturday) but must be removed within three days after Memorial Day (by Thursday, May 30). All remaining flowers will be disposed of by the Cemetery.

Small United States flags welcomed two days before and through Memorial Day and must be reclaimed by those placing them.
