### Pentecost - The Birthday of the Church

Jesus told the Eleven: "Wait here until you are clothed with power from on high; then you will be my witnesses to the ends of the earth." The public mission of the Church began with the Gift of the Spirit on Pentecost. That selfsame Spirit continues to guide and invigorate us today.

At every Mass you have been to, the Spirit has come upon bread and wine to change them into the Body and Blood of Jesus. The Spirit has encouraged and supported every deed of kindness, every act of service, every sacrifice of love you have made. The Spirit has helped you every time you prayed, and forgiven your sins in every confession. The Spirit teaches you to recognize Truth, reminding you of all Jesus has said and helping you to hear the Voice of Christ among all the voices that constantly clamor for our attention. The Spirit is the last of the Persons of the Trinity to be revealed, and most often works in quiet, hidden, subtle ways. It is not that the Spirit is shy or distant, but because the Spirit is Love, and love always focuses on the other, not the self.

The Sequence for this feast is one of my favorite prayers in the rich heritage of our faith; pray it today, and whenever you need spiritual strength and hope.

Come, Holy Spirit, come and from Your celestial home shed a ray of light divine.

Come, Father of the poor, come, source of all our store, come, within our bosoms shine.

You, of comforters the best, You, the soul's most welcome Guest, sweet refreshment here below.

In our labor, rest most sweet, grateful coolness in the heat, solace in the midst of woe.

O most blessed Light divine, shine within these hearts of Yours, and our inmost being fill.

Where You are not, we have naught, nothing good in deed or thought, nothing free from taint of ill.

Heal our wounds, our strength renew, on our dryness pour Your dew, wash the stains of guilt away.

Bend the stubborn heart and will, melt the frozen, warm the chill, guide the steps that go astray.

On the faithful, who adore and confess You, evermore in Your seven-fold gifts descend.

Give them virtue's sure reward, give them Your salvation, Lord, give them joys that never end.

Amen. Alleluia.

### LIVING A LIFE OF DISCIPLESHIP



Throughout our readings today, we see the amazing truth that the Holy Spirit gives us gifts and guidance in a very personal way. We are meant to use these gifts to build up the Body of Christ in a way that is unique to each one of us.

Our first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, recalls the dramatic moment when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the apostles. "Suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim."

Notice how personal and individual is this outpouring of the Spirit. This personalized way of "gifting" the apostles allowed them each to reach different people, sharing with them the "mighty acts of God." Embracing the stewardship way of life means that we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us in the best use of the unique gifts He has given to each of us, to accomplish the particular mission entrusted to us.

Jesus gives us this mission in our Gospel passage from John. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." But we must not let this responsibility overwhelm us. Jesus Himself, tells us so — "Peace be with you."

As this Easter season comes to a close, let us be at peace. And let us resolve to lean on the Holy Spirit more and more as our guide through the stewardship way of life. Catholic Stewardship Consultants:



### ST. FRANCIS XAVIER CEMETERY

A second columbarium (for interment of cremation remains) was installed Monday, May 22. There will be some finishing work that may take a little longer, but this will give us room to continue to meet the needs of parishioners seeking their final resting place. We still have many gravesites available for traditional burials (or 2 cremations buried on 1 gravesite) as well and room for future expansion as needed. We are blessed to have a parish cemetery.

Water has been turned on for those who have real plants and flowers in pots. Please remember, only single pole plant stands are approved for holding flower pots. And, only 1 plant stand per monument/marker. This is to keep things easier to maintain and work around. Shepherd's hooks are not approved, and they can be a hazard to the equipment used at the cemetery and the staff.

For Memorial Day, the decorating rules are relaxed a bit and items are allowed on the ground. Please remove those items by Monday, June 5<sup>th</sup>. Any items remaining on the ground after that day will be discarded. If you've placed a flag (or other items) in the ground, it would be allowed if placed in a pot on a single pole plant stand. The cemetery is closed from dusk until dawn, and solar lights are NOT allowed in the cemetery.
