The Eucharistic Revival Parish Year

In the Diocese of Saint Cloud, the Parish Year of the Eucharistic Revival will begin with the feast of our diocesan patron, St. Cloud, on September 7. All are invited to join in the Diocesan Eucharistic Congress, September 7-9. The theme, "Becoming Eucharist," is taken from a quote by St. Augustine (354-430) who said: "Behold who you are, become what you receive." In the Eucharist, we receive the Body of Christ and so become the Body of Christ in the world to continue the mission of the Gospel.

Each parish will offer a variety of activities for the Revival year. Some will be in common, others unique to each community. We are working on a calendar of events and opportunities for the year. In addition to opportunities for prayer, adoration, education and study, we are planning some service and outreach events as well, since the Christ we receive in the Eucharist is the Christ who tells us: "Whatever you do to the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you do for me"; and "There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends."

One outreach project we are planning is to invite your free will offerings towards the purchase of a tabernacle (or perhaps more than one, depending on the response) to be placed in a church across the globe where we have connections through our diocesan Mission Office. Details are being worked out, but it will be a beautiful and ongoing connection in the Body of Christ, reminding us that we are part of one Church centered on our faith, hope, and love in

Jesus. Please watch for more details on this witness to our Communion in the Lord.




