4. Deepen participation in the life of the church through liturgy and worship.
5. Practice missionary discipleship through Christian service.

POSITION: CATECHIST – SMALL GROUP FACILITATOR

Overview and Service Impact: Being a Small Group Catechist is deeply connected to the gifts we are given at Baptism and that are strengthened at Confirmation. It is worth taking the time to discern if God is calling you to serve in this way. Small Group Catechists will assist Lead or Co-Lead Catechists in faith formation sessions for various age groups, exploring topics of faith and helping to nurture the faith of classroom participants by fostering discussion and completion of assigned activities for a group of six to eight participants within the larger group. They will walk with the Lead or Co-Lead Catechist in one of the following groups as they help them to come to know their Catholic faith and love God in a deeper way: adults, middle school youth or high school youth.

Key Responsibilities:

- Attend the scheduled meetings/training sessions and retreats and pursue continuing education opportunities as well as opportunities for spiritual growth
- Become familiar with the Lead or Co-Lead Catechist as well as the classroom they will be working from
- Familiarize themselves with the syllabus for the year, the catechetical texts and resources, the diocesan guidelines for the grade group they have chosen/been assigned and, if appropriate, the characteristics of middle school/high school youth appropriate to their grade group
- Arrive early to assist the Lead or Co-Lead Catechist in set up and checking supplies
- Assist Lead or Co-Lead Catechist with hands-on projects and group activities, leading or directing small discussion/work groups with assigned tasks and in handing out supplies, blackline masters and other handouts within the classroom setting
- Model God's grace in relationships within the class and in particular the small group. Relate to the participants in a compassionate and respectful manner and help Lead or Co-Lead Catechist to foster a sense of security as well as a safe space with participants by upholding boundaries and guidelines for classroom participation
- Assist Lead or Co-Lead Catechist as needed in handling classroom management, seeking help from the Director of Faith Formation for any issues that arise within the classroom
- Be familiar with Diocesan Safe Environment policies and report any issues of safe environment, emergency medical needs or unsafe classroom behaviors to the Director of Faith Formation or the Pastor immediately
- Have fun and enjoy the growth in faith, fellowship and community that comes from helping in a small group of learners!

Time Commitment: Small Group Catechists will be responsible for helping in 12 – 1 to 1½ hour sessions per school year as well as attending three – 1 hour scheduled meetings/training sessions per school year, two – 2 hour retreats per school year and continuing ed/spiritual growth opportunities.

Qualifications/Requirements: Small Group Catechists should be practicing faith-filled and faithful Catholics willing to model and share the Gospel message with others in a classroom setting. They should have a good basic knowledge of their faith and be willing to grow in that knowledge through continuing education and spiritual opportunities as well as being willing to take direction and give direction when needed. They should model Christian values and have a servant’s heart and style of leadership, show spiritual maturity, be a good communicator and listener with a heart for others, as well as being dependable, consistent and committed to their area of ministry. Additionally, they should be willing to make time to practice good self-care. As someone who is helping to nurture others in their faith, it’s vital that the Small Group Catechist spend time taking care of their own spirituality, physical and emotional health. Safe environment training and background checks for the Diocese of St. Cloud must be completed and an initial discernment meeting with the Director of Faith Formation will be required.

Training Provided: In order to develop and strengthen the skills for ministry as a Small Group Catechist, opportunities for training will be provided at the scheduled meetings as well as through other resources that will be made available throughout the year. The first scheduled meeting will provide an orientation/refresher for Small Group Catechists and it is during this meeting curriculum and other materials will be distributed.
